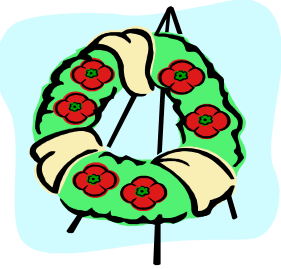

REMEMBRANCE DAY

The school will be closed on Wednesday, November 11th in recognition of Remembrance Day. The observance of Remembrance Day is often a difficult concept for children to grasp when we enjoy living in a time of peace in our

country. Yet in other regions of the world, fighting continues and peace is only something that is hoped for or talked about.

We will be having a Remembrance Day assembly at school on Tuesday, November 10th for students but would ask that parents take some time with their children to discuss the significance of Remembrance Day and how it relates to our lives today.

Once again, the Royal Canadian Legion has requested permission from the School District to place poppies in the school to help commemorate Canadians who fought and died in the wars. The poppies will be in schools for students on Tuesday, November 10th. It is understood that every child will receive a poppy. There will be an opportunity for the children to make a donation, however, no child will be made to feel that they must donate to receive a poppy-all will receive a poppy if they so wish.
