# 2010/2011 Registration and Transfer Requests

These procedures for registration and transfer requests are in effect for the 2010/2011 school year. These procedures are consistent with the North Vancouver School District [Policy 605: Admission of Students](#),

Priorities for student placement are dependent upon place of residence as well as meeting registration and transfer deadlines. Please refer to [School Catchment Areas](#) to determine the school catchment area for your place of residence.

The following dates will be in effect for the 2010/2011 school year:

<b>March 5, 2010</b>	Deadline for priority placement consideration for new registrations for Kindergarten to Grade 12
<b>April 1, 2010</b>	Deadline for priority placement consideration for transfers for Grades 1 to 12

## Information about [New Kindergarten Registrations](#)

### New Registrations Grades 1 to 12

All children new to North Vancouver (not currently attending a school in North Vancouver School District), must register at Central Registration beginning January 25, 2010. Registration deadline for priority placement is March 5, 2010.

All registrations require the student's birth certificate, (if not born in Canada, bring proof of citizenship, passport and Permanent Resident Card), proof of current residence at the date of application, (BC Hydro bill, Purchase agreement, or if Tenancy agreement, to also include a letter from the landlord and a copy of the landlord's Hydro bill). A copy of the report card from the previous school is also required.

### Late French Immersion - Grade 6 Entry

Late French Immersion is designed for non-French speaking students. Following two years in Grade 6 and 7 at the elementary level, Late French Immersion students complete their bilingual program with their peers from the Early French Immersion program at a secondary French Immersion school.

A Late French Immersion Parent Information meeting will be held on January 20, 2010, at 7:00 p.m. at the Leo Marshall Curriculum Centre, 810 West 21st Street (north of Capilano Mall - access via Fell or Hamilton Avenues), North Vancouver BC.

Registration for Late French Immersion will begin on January 25, 2010. The registration deadline is March 5, 2010.

Students who would like to attend a French Immersion Secondary School other than their designated French Immersion school must complete a Transfer Form. Placement will depend on space and facilities availability.

### Continuing Students

Students currently attending schools in North Vancouver are not required to apply annually to continue their registration in their current school.

### Transfer Requests

Students requesting a transfer to another North Vancouver school must submit a Transfer Request Form between January 25, 2010 and April 1, 2010 for priority placement (this includes transfer of program from French to English). This form will be available at all school offices, this website, and Central Registration as of January 2010. [All transfer forms must be submitted to the Central Registration Office.](#)

Following April 1, 2010, no further transfer requests will be accepted unless the student has moved into the requested catchment area.

By completing a transfer request, the applicant is committed, if the transfer is approved, to accept any of the proposed receiving schools as indicated on the Transfer Request Form.

International students apply for transfers through the International Student Office.

## Kindergarten Registration 2010

A student (family) can register for kindergarten if, on or before December 31st of that school year, the student has reached the age of 5 years. For the 2010/2011 school year, the student must reach 5 years of age prior to December 31, 2010.

## PROGRAM OPTIONS

### French Immersion Half-Day Kindergarten program

This is a District Program with limited space at selected sites. For the 2010/2011 school year, all French Immersion classes will continue to be half-day classes.

The following schools will be offering French Immersion in 2010/2011:

**English Full-Day Kindergarten Program**

For September 2010, the North Vancouver School District has been able to make Full-Day Kindergarten (FDK) available in 24 of the school district's 28 elementary schools. For the 2010/2011 school year, the FDK program will only be available to those students in the English program.

**English Half-Day Kindergarten Program**

For the 2010/2011 school year, the North Vancouver School District will be offering the half-day kindergarten program at the following schools. As the ministry is phasing-in FDK over two years, not all schools could be accommodated for September 2010.

Note: If additional FDK spaces are made available the school district may be able to offer FDK at these locations:

English Half-Day Kindergarten Program
Braemar (1 class)
Cleveland (1 class)
Dorothy Lynas (2 classes)
Ross Road (1 class)
Windsor House (1 class)

Note: Maximum class size for Kindergarten is 22 students. One class = maximum 22 students and two classes = 44 students, etc.

**PLACEMENT PROCEDURES**

Registrations received prior to the deadline (on or before March 5th) will be placed according to priority placement criteria; please see below.

Effective date of registration is entered when all required documentation has been received. A registration without all required documentations will be pending until all the required documents are submitted.

Registrations received following the deadline (after March 5th) will be placed according to space and facilities availability.

- Priority for placement of students in Full and Half Day English program:
- Priority 1 – In Catchment area
  - Priority 2 – Out of Catchment area with sibling already attending same school/program
  - Priority 3 – Out of Catchment
  - Priority 4 – Out of District

Note: The place of residence at the time of application determines the status of the applicant as a catchment area, out of catchment area, or out of district child.

Please refer to School Locator to determine the school catchment area for your place of residence.

Priority for placement of students in French Immersion (District Program):

Priority 1 – Siblings of French Immersion students (same program, same school)

Priority 2 – Lottery for the remaining students - classes are filled by lottery order respecting the parents 1st and 2nd choices.

Priority 3 – Out of district – placed at the end of the process

Note: A District Program (French Immersion) means those programs that have the entire School District as the catchment area.

Students not placed in the French Immersion program are placed in the kindergarten program at their catchment area school or at a school of their choice (if indicated on their registration form). These students are also placed on a French Immersion (kindergarten) waitlist according to their placement in the lottery, and their first and second choice of schools. The staff at Central Registration will be in contact with the students (families) on the waitlist when the space becomes available. Once a spot is offered, the students (families) have 1 business day to respond or the spot will be offered to the next student on the waitlist.

The kindergarten placement information will be mailed to the parents prior to the end of April, 2010.
