SCHOLARSHIP

- **Terry Fox Humanitarian Award** – (*\$7000 annually paid directly to the institution in two installments for students who do not pay tuition fees, the award is \$ 3500 per year, paid directly to the institution in two installments of \$ 1750 each*). The award is tenable for a maximum of four years. **Eligibility** – involvement in voluntary humanitarian work, Canadian citizen or landed immigrant, will be attending a Canadian University this fall, maintain a satisfactory academic standing and community work. **Criteria** – dedication to the humanitarian ideals of Terry Fox, volunteer experience, courage in overcoming obstacles, participation in sport, fitness and community service, academic standing. **How to apply** – student must submit an application form in MS Word format, three referee forms, and an official transcript of the past two yrs of schooling, no other forms are required. **The deadline is February 1, 2010.** **Application is attached with this email**
- **Lindsay Gordon Memorial Scholarship** – the scholarship is awarded annually to a graduating Grade 12 female student who is currently playing soccer, has played at least a portion of her soccer career with the North Shore Girls Soccer Club and who has achieved excellence in three areas: soccer, academics and community service. Student need to complete the application form, provide an official transcript of her marks, and provide letters of reference from her current soccer coach and from the principal or vice principal of the school. Download the application www.nsgsc.ca by clicking “documents/forms” the deadline for the application is April 25, 2010.

Reminder:

- **Outdoor School Alumni Scholarship (\$500)** – This scholarship fund recognizes graduating high school students who have demonstrated an outstanding commitment to environmental and social leadership. Applicants must be a grade 12 student; plan to attend a post-secondary institution upon graduation, have counselled at Outdoor School at least two times between grades 10 & 12 (one time must have occurred in grade 11 or 12). Have shown a commitment to and social leadership. Return the application with photocopies of two counselor evaluations and an interim report card. **Application forms are outside Ms. Roberts office.** **Original copies must be postmarked by March 16, 2010.**




POST-SECONDARY
