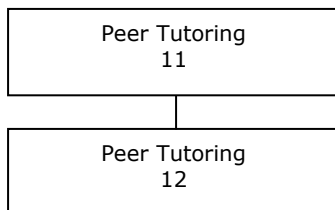


## PEER TUTORING

## COURSES

### **Peer Tutoring 11 (YIPS1A), 12 (YIPS2A)**

These courses each offer 4 credits towards graduation. Peer tutors work in the Learning Centre one-on-one with selected junior students. Participation in this course involves direct instruction by teaching staff and guided tutoring with junior students. In taking on a mentoring role, senior students will be expected to learn the basic tenets of mentorship, the concepts associated with differentiated learning styles, and the value of goal setting and personal development. Tutors need to be responsible and reliable. Through coursework, students will have the opportunity to develop many communication, leadership, organizational, and interpersonal skills. Successful peer tutors come from a wide array of backgrounds and experiences but must be academically successful students – enthusiasm and an eagerness to work with people are mandatory!
